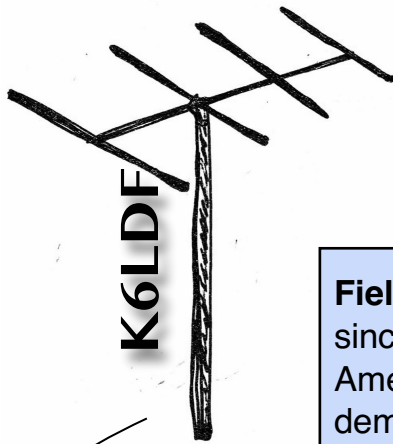


ARRL Field Day 2018

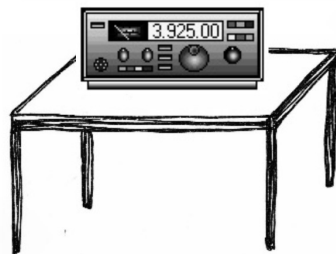
The American Radio Relay League's

Field Day is ham radio's open house. It has been an annual event since 1933. Every June, more than 40,000 hams throughout North America set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate ham radio's science, skill and service to our communities and our nation. **Field Day is also a contest.** Radio operators make as many contacts as they can, on as many frequencies and modes as possible, in a 24-hour period...and they do it all with emergency power sources! This year's theme is the ARRL's International Grid Chase.

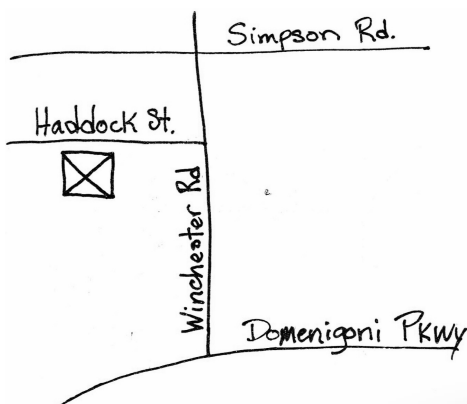
